	Course	Number of Years/Explanation
A	History/social science	<p>Two years including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • One year of world history, cultures, and historical geography • Two semesters of U.S. history or one semester of U.S. history and one semester of American government or civics
B	English	<p>Four years of college preparatory English that integrates reading of classic and modern literature, frequent and regular writing, and listening and speaking.</p>
C	Mathematics	<p>Three years of college-preparatory mathematics including or integrating topics covered in:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Elementary algebra • Advanced algebra • Two – and three-dimensional geometry <p>Also acceptable are courses that address the above content areas, and include or integrate:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Trigonometry • Statistics
D	Laboratory science	<p>Two years, providing fundamental knowledge in two of the following disciplines:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Biology • Chemistry • Physics
E	Language other than English	Two years of the same non-English language
F	Visual and performing arts	One year chosen from dance, drama/theater, music, or visual art
G	College-preparatory elective	<p>One year of</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • An additional approved “a-f” course beyond the minimum required for that subject area, or of a course that; or • A course that combines any of the “a-f” subject areas in an interdisciplinary fashion
